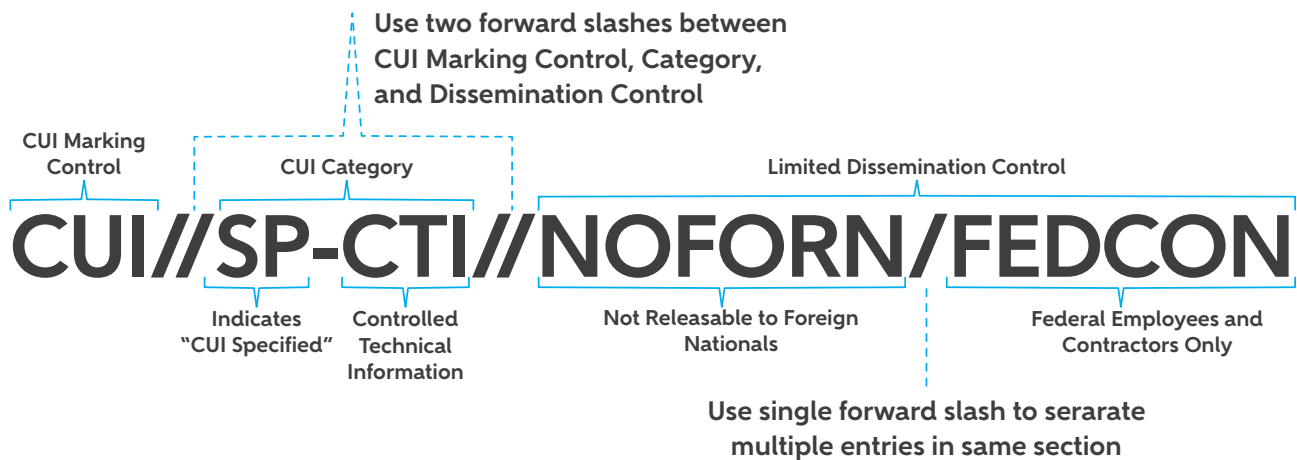


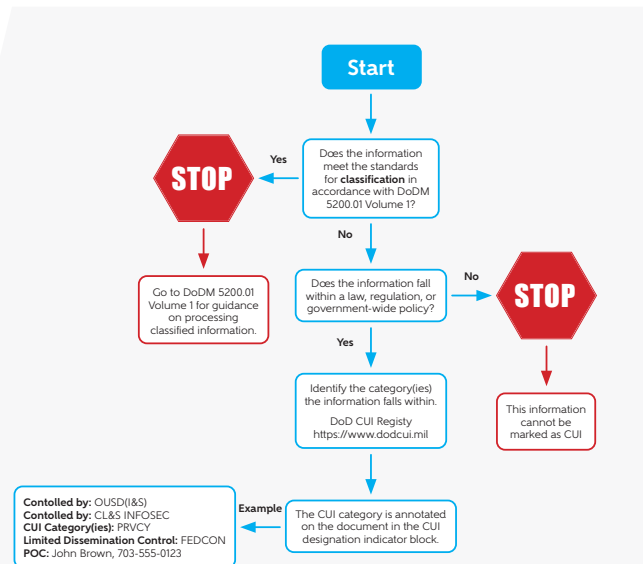

What is CUI?

CUI PROTECTION

- During work hours do not read, discuss, or leave CUI information unattended where unauthorized personnel are present.
- After work hours, CUI information will be stored in unlocked containers, desks or cabinets if security for continuous monitoring of access is provided.
- If building security is not provided, information will be stored in locked desks, file cabinets, or locked rooms.
- CUI information and material may be transmitted via first class mail, parcel post, or, bulk shipments.
- CUI information may be transmitted electronically via approved secure communications systems (encrypted).



CUI policy provides a uniform marking system across the federal government that replaces a variety of agency-specific markings such as FOUO, LES and SBU.

WHAT IS FOUO?

FOUO, or For Official Use Only, is a document designation, not a classification. It is used by the Department of Defense and a number of other federal agencies to identify information or material which, although unclassified, may not be appropriate for public release.

What is CUI?

CUI stands for Controlled Unclassified Information. *CUI is a document designation, not a classification.* CUI is government created or owned information that requires safeguarding. It is information the government creates or possesses that is protected by law, regulation, or government-wide policy. CUI is not classified information.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CUI AND FOUO?

CUI is a marking that is used to indicate the presence of CUI basic information. FOUO is a legacy marking used to indicate sensitivity based on agency policy or practice.

CUI Markings are applied only to those information types (categories) found on the CUI registry.
